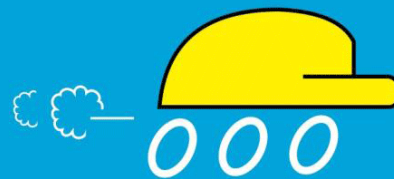

Our Visitors Today

Thatcham Town Football Club was founded in 1894. The club were originally known as Thatcham, with Town being added to its name in 1974. In the early years Thatcham played at The Marsh on Dunston Green, Brownsfield (home of the Cricket Club) and Station Road, before moving to Lancaster Close in 1949. Floodlights were erected in January 1983 with Fulham FC visiting for a friendly to commemorate their switching on. To provide improved facilities the club moved to Waterside Park in 1992/93.

The club joined the Reading Temperance League in 1896, winning the Division Two title in 1905/06. In 1953 Thatcham became founder members of the Hellenic League and won promotion to the Premier Division as Division One champions in 1958/59, 1964/65 and 1972/73. The club then won the Hellenic Premier Division title in 1974/75. Following spells in the Athenian and London Spartan Leagues, the club joined the newly formed Wessex League in 1986 and won the title in 1995/96. After finishing second in 2005/06, ground requirements were met and promotion to step four achieved.

The Kingfishers spent eight seasons in the Southern League Division One – seven in the South & West Division and one (2012/13) in the Central. After sixth-placed finishes in 2006/07 and 2008/09, the club achieved its highest ever position in 2010/11. Despite being in the bottom half of the table at Christmas, the club earned 38 points from the final 15 matches to finish in fifth, however Thatcham were beaten at Sholing in the play-off semi-final.

Once safety was assured in 2013/14, the club resigned from the Southern League to cut costs by playing at a lower level. Town finished twelfth in their first campaign back in the Hellenic Premier, and finished second and fourth the next two seasons. However in 2017/18 the club embarked on an incredible 40 game unbeaten run which saw them overtake long-time leaders Highworth Town and eventually pip Bracknell Town to the title on goal difference.

In 1989 Thatcham reached the last eight of the FA Vase before losing to local rivals Hungerford Town. In the same competition a record attendance of 1,400 was set when Aldershot Town won 1-0 at Waterside Park in 1993/94. However in 2017/18 Thatcham went all the way and lifted the trophy at Wembley Stadium on a brilliant day for the club.

Victory over Bromsgrove Sporting brought realisation the club could be on the verge of something special, then over 2,200 attended the quarter-final win at Melksham Town as cup fever swept the town. Thatcham beat 1874 Northwich 1-0 and 3-2 in the two-legged semi-final, and took over 5,000 fans to Wembley as Stockton Town were defeated 1-0 in the final.

1996/97 saw Thatcham's best FA Cup run as they reached the Fourth Qualifying Round, but the club are yet to progress beyond the Second Qualifying Round of the FA Trophy.

Thatcham completed the Hellenic league and cup double, by lifting the Hellenic First Division Cup in 1972/73 and the Premier Division Cup in 1974/75.

Also in 2017/18 the club reached both league cup finals, only to lose to Bracknell in the Challenge Cup and Binfield in the Floodlit Cup. Meanwhile during the 1990s Thatcham won the Wessex League Cup on four occasions, completing the double in 1995/96. In 1974/75 the club lost the final of the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup but were awarded the trophy following a dispute between Wycombe Wanderers and the Berks & Bucks FA.

Following on from the club's best ever season, the club are hungry for more success and enter 2018/19 back in the Southern League, ready to renew some old rivalries in Division 1 South.

Slimbridge 0-4 Blackfield & Langley

Saturday 29th December 2018

Swans downed by league leaders clinical finishing.

Slimbridge's unbeaten run came to a crashing halt by the league leaders who took their chances well in a dominant second half performance despite the Swans strong first half showing.

The visitors Fatah Makhloufi had the first chance of the game, but his shot was blocked by the Swans defence. The hosts then started brightly with Sam Mendes linking up with Edji Mbunga who fed the ball through to Will Hawes forcing a save from Lewis Noice. From the corner Ioan Richards headed wide. Mark Magee chased a long ball down the middle but Noice got their first colliding with his team mate Adedye Olumuyiwa as he collected the ball, the Blackfield defender was able to continue after treatment.

Slimbridge continued to press Christien Turner's shot from a corner was blocked before Ewen Dunbar picked up the loose ball forcing another save from Noice. Lerone Plummer was becoming a handful for the Swans defence, Richards doing well to force the striker wide and his shot sailing over the bar from a narrow angle.

On 21 minutes Slimbridge gained a corner, which saw Dunbar's cross back in cut out for a second corner from which Myron Turner hit wide of the post. Owen Fee broke free on the right but his cross landed into the arms of home keeper Lewis Adams. Adams was then on hand to tip away Ryan Oatley's cross under pressure before Plummer fired wide.

Match Reports

The visitors should have taken the lead on the half hour, Mitchell Speechley-Price burst through the Swans defence and with only Adams to beat put the ball over the bar. A delightful cross field ball from Dan King on the left found Dunbar on the right but his shot was high and wide of the visitor's goal.

With 35 minutes on the clock, Christien Turner pulled out a last gasp tackle on Plummer to concede a corner as the striker ventured alone into the box. The corner was not dealt with by the home side allowing Adam Tomasso to head against the bar the ball coming back into the path of Plummer who made no mistake from a few yards out giving the visitors the lead.

As half time approached Slimbridge were looking for a way back into the game, Hawes finding the arms of Noice from a cross on the right. King fired in a free kick deep in the visitors half towards the far right post which required the quick reactions of Noice to push the ball wide for a Swans corner.

A disastrous start to the second half for the home side, Speechley-Price guiding his header past Adams from a pin point cross on 47 minutes. Less than ten minutes later the lead was increased to three when a Blackfield corner was cleared by the home defence to Speechley-Price who fired into the top corner from 20 yards out.

On the hour mark, Swans manager Lee Driver-Dickerson brought on all three substitutes in an attempt to recover something from the game. This moved unfortunately failed as on 69 minutes the visitors sealed the game with Tomasso heading in at the back post from a well taken corner.

Slimbridge managed a couple of late chances Yeshaya Lomotey finding Noice's hands from 25 yards before Lomotey put a neat through ball to Magee however Noice was quick to clear.

Next up for the Swans is a New Year's day trip to Cinderford Town before returning to Thornhill Park next Saturday 5th January to host 2018 FA Vase winners Thatcham Town.

Match Reports

Cinderford Town 1-0 Slimbridge

Tuesday 1st January 2019

Swans fall to defeat with a strong defensive performance to survive an early battering by a rampant Cinderford Town side.

The home side started like an express train Richard Greaves missing two early chances Lewis Collins also firing a weak shot at Lewis Adams in the Swans goal before Ben Watkins cross just sailed wide of the far post.

It was in the 11th minute that Cinderford made the breakthrough, Collins on the left skipped passed Korey Pring before delivering a pin point cross to Josh Hunt to tap in at the far post. Moment later Collins escaped the attentions of Myron Turner forcing a double save out of Adams. This was immediately followed by another home attack Collins initial shot being saved by Adams then Pring heading off the line by Greaves follow up.

With only 20 minutes gone, Slimbridge were lucky to have been only a single goal down as the home side had enough chances to have been at least 4-5 ahead. It was not until 23 minutes that Slimbridge finally had sight of the Cinderford goal, Ewen Dunbar's shot straight at keeper Alex Harris.

As Cinderford continued to attack with a number of crosses coming into the Swans box from the full backs Sam Turl and Lewis Binns they failed to find a home player and the visitors were able to clear the danger. As half time approached Hunt's header forced a save from Adams from a long range cross field ball.

Match Reports

Swans manager Lee Driver-Dickerson introduced Joe Noakes at the start of the second half replacing debutant Archie Brennan and a shift in formation from 5 to 4 across the back. This change gave Slimbridge a bit of early momentum Myron Turner shooting just over after a good run through the middle.

Cinderford continued to press for a second goal the ball flashing across the Swans goalmouth from the left and Turl's follow-up blocked and cleared away to safety. Collins broke through the visiting defence and with just Adams to beat fired past the keeper only to see the ball strike the post.

Yeshaya Lomotey fierce shot was blocked by the home defence the subsequent corner was then claimed by Harris. Greaves headed the ball into the net on 56 minutes but the referee's assistant had his flag up for offside.

Dan King now playing in a midfield position was tripped by Andy Lewis as he ran towards goal resulting in a Slimbridge free kick 35 yards out from goal as the visitors started to put a little pressure on the home side. King's delivery was headed down to Noakes whose initial shot was blocked before Dunbar's follow-up was also stopped by the home defence.

On the hour Lomotey's 25 yard shot was deflected for a corner from which Pring headed over the bar. Moments later Mark Magee fired just over before King's cross was cleared as Magee lurked in the box.

Cinderford still looking dangerous going forward fired a 25 yard free kick wide after a handball from Noakes.

Match Reports

With just over 10 minutes to go a home side corner was dropped by Adams and bundled into the back of the Swans net but the goal was ruled out for a foul in the box to the relief of the visiting fans. Dean Turner conceded a corner blocking an in swinging cross from which the ball flashed across the Slimbridge goal mouth missing the on running strikers.

Moments later another home side free kick from just over 25 yards was flashed inches past the post by Dan MacDonald. With a couple of minutes to go Ioan Richards cross found Dean Turner in the box Harris managing to claim the ball at the second attempt from Turners toes but the referee had blown for a foul on Harris. The last chance of the game came in stoppage time Lomotey's chip deflected wide for a corner and then Pring heading the corner wide at the far post.

The Swans go again next Saturday facing 2018 FA Vase winners Thatcham town at Thornhill Park with a 3pm kick off.
