Our Visitors Today

Larkhall Athletic Football Club dates from 1914. In 1951, after a break through the 1940s, the club regained access to its home at Plain Ham following a plea to the City of Bath Council to return Plain Ham to a sports field. It had been turned over to allotments during WW II. Since then, it has gone from strength to strength, achieving the status in 2004 as a Premier Club and in 2008 as an FA Charter Standard Community Club; the first club to achieve this recognition in Bath. This status was renewed in 2011 and 2014.

Initially the club rented the Plain Ham match by match. It offered a sloping pitch, a timber hut for changing and a single tin bath for washing, a nearby standpipe providing the water source. In 1962 a cricket team was formed and the club became Larkhall Sports Club. Around the same time the then Bath City Council granted the club a long lease on the ground at Plain Ham. Erection of a small club house began in 1965.

In 1975 the main football pitch at Plain Ham was levelled to create a surface suitable for senior football. In 1983 the club house and changing rooms were doubled in size and in 1989 the club purchased adjoining land at Pows Field which today is seldom used for matches, but provides a valuable space for overflow parking on match days, mid-week training, pre-match warm-ups and social events.

In 1996, aided by a Lottery Grant, the club further extended its club house, enlarging the changing rooms, incorporating secure storage, a laundry and a kitchen and improving access and disabled facilities. In 2004 Plain Ham was re-levelled, drainage improved and floodlights installed, all with the help of the Football Stadia Improvement Fund.

At the same time the car park was extended and new floodlights installed on what was a training area in front of the club house and is now leased to the City of Bath Petanque Club.

In 2005, with tremendous financial support from the local community and members past and present, the club completed the purchase of Plain Ham from the Bath and North East Somerset Local Authority.

In 2007 the hard standing was increased in size and in 2008 it was further extended to border three sides of the pitch and to incorporate a protected walkway from the changing rooms. At the same time the existing covered viewing area was tripled in size and 55 seats installed; an additional 45 seats were added in 2009 and a further 55 in 2013.

In 2011 the hard standing was further extended to completely surround the pitch. At the same time substantial ground work was undertaken to stabilise the far corner of the pitch: new fencing was installed, new safety rails were constructed in front of the stand, a turnstile was created at the entrance and new lighting was connected. To address ongoing drainage problems the pitch was gravel banded from across the pitch. Funding from the Football Stadia Improvement Fund helped towards this work.

Late in 2011 the club was successful with applications for funding to Sport England and the Football Stadia Improvement Fund for new changing rooms, and to remodel the clubhouse to provide improved toilets and hospitality facilities for spectators and visiting officials. The formal opening of the re-vamped and extended facilities was celebrated with guest of honour the Mayor of Bath, Councillor Malcolm Lees, on 16 August 2013.

In late 2013, friends of the club contributed to more facility improvements that had been identified in order to satisfy Grade E of the FA Grading requirements. These included additional seats, more covered standing, improved turnstiles and new outside toilets. This was completed ahead of the 31 March 2014 deadline enabling us to accept promotion in what was our double winning centenary year. Further facility improvements enabled us to satisfy the Grade D requirements. Half of the funding for this work came from the Football Stadia Improvement Fund.

In 2014 we celebrated our centenary year with gusto. Our performances on the field provided a wonderful backdrop, our manager was selected as Manager of the Year by the Western League, we were treated to a marvellous reception in the Guildhall Bath hosted jointly by the Mayor of Bath and the Chairman of BANES Council, we enjoyed a wonderful evening with the great Gordon Banks at the Oriel Hall, Larkhall and returned to the Guildhall for our Centenary Dinner in September 2014 where the Chairman of BANES Council was our guest of honour.

On 18 Jul 15 two international standard petanque terrains were opened at the club, marking the start of what we hope will be a productive and mutually beneficial relationship with the City of Bath Petanque club, who have established their headquarters at the club.

On the pitch the club boasts a long list of honours. In its early days the club lead the way in the local Bath and District Saturday League and in Somerset Junior Football where the club was pre-eminent for many seasons before advancing to senior football.

Since then the club secured the Somerset Senior Cup in seasons in 1975-76 and 2003-04, the Western League First Division Championship in 1988-89 and 2008-09, the Western League Premier Division Championship in 2010-11 and the Western League double - Premier Division Championship and Les Phillips Cup – in 2013-14. The Larks reached the last 16 of the FA Vase three seasons in succession.

In 2014 we accepted promotion to the Southern League. Our first season was a huge success and we reached the play-offs before losing in the play-off final to Stratford Town. We also enjoyed a wonderful FA Cup campaign defeating Merthyr Town and Truro City both away before losing at Gosport Borough, then of the FA Conference, in a replay.

The 2014-15 season produced successes for the Reserve team that just missed out on promotion to the Premier Division of the Somerset County Football League and the Women's team won the Somerset FA County Cup at their third appearance in the final. In 2015-16 they repeated the performance, defeating Keynsham Town 4-1. In the same season the men's team reached the final of the Somerset Premier Cup, losing 2-1 to Wells City at Taunton FC. In the league we finished in 11th position.

In October 2016 Wayne Thorne opted to stand down from his managerial role and was replaced by his assistant Geraint Bater who was in turn assisted by Neil Arndale. Unfortunately work and family priorities led Geraint to an early decision to relinquish his role only to be replaced by father Phil in January 2017. In 2017-18 Phil had been joined by Neil Arndale in the dug-out. We finished in 15th position and reached the semi-final of the Southern League cup, losing on penalties at Didcot Town.

On our journey to the semi-final we took the very creditable scalp of Weymouth Town, away under lights on a damp night in early January.

For season 2018-19 the Southern League was restructured to comprise two Premier Divisions – Central and South which are at step 3 of the National League System (NLS) and two regional divisions: Division One Central and Division One South which are at step 4 of the NLS. For us the revamped Division One South proved a highly competitive Division with a strong contingent of clubs that we had known for many years in the Western League and FA Vase. We eventually finished in 13th position, only 1 point lower than the 10th place finishers AFC Totton.

The women's team progressed from the *South West Women's* Premier League which they won in 2013, to the FA Women's Premier League South West Division One which is at the fourth level of the Women's football pyramid. In 2018-19 the Ladies finished in 7th position in this division. Nicola O'Connell, the leading light of the women's team for more than 10 years, in 2017-18 received the prestigious award of Women's Player of the Year from the Women's Premier League, Southern Division. Her award was richly deserved and is a massive credit to her and the club.

The youth section continues to prosper, and we now cover 12 year groups including a girls' section. In May 2019 we enjoyed another successful six-a-side tournament involving 25 local clubs, 1000 players, 13 age groups and over 250 games of football played, all on Plain Ham.

The award of Somerset FA Charter Standard Community Club of the Season for 2014-15 and the successful continuing health checks on our Standard Charter status in large measure is a tribute to the dedication of the youth section of the club.

In 2019 the Larkhall Athletic Supporters' Club was formally launched. It encourages and enables supporters and friends of the Larks to contribute to the operation and development of the club. It has already demonstrated its value and future potential by taking ownership of our merchandising efforts, supporting our Family Fun Day in July 2019 and contributing productively to the close season maintenance and development activities.

In the 2018-19 close season we have pulled out all the stops to completely re-model the clubhouse. The upgraded and updated facilities includes a refitted kitchen with all new appliances, an enlarged and completely re-decorated interior with modern lighting, an enlarged front door to cope with modern disability chairs, new flooring and new furniture which will provide us with a comfortable and contemporary home for many seasons to come. We are most grateful to Tom Gilbert for taking the lead and to the skilled construction team of PT Masonry.

In 2008 Larkhall Sports Club was recognised as the BANES Club of the Year by the Chairman of BANES Council. In December 2011 we were selected by our local paper, the Bath Chronicle, as the local sports team of the year; quite an honour given the richness of the local competition. In 2011, two of the club's longest serving officials were recognised by the Somerset County FA. Tony Grace received the award of Somerset County FA Volunteer of the Year and Phil Tiley was presented with a Somerset County FA Long Service Award.

In 2012 the Somerset FA added Clive Burge to our hall of fame by recognising his 'Outstanding Contribution to Community Football', one of the top awards available to the County FA. In 2014 we were once again selected by the local paper for an award this time as Senior Team of the Year. In 2015 we were selected by the Somerset FA as the County's Charter Standard Community Club of the year.

This season will be our sixth in the Southern League. We are now an established member of the Southern League community and tie our ambitions to progression through the League, although an FA Cup run would be richly appreciated.

Playing Squad

Shaun Semmens (28) Goalkeeper. An athletic shot-stopper, Shaun signed for the Larks in January 2017 from Mangotsfield United, having started his career playing for Godolphin Atlantic in Cornwall. He was awarded man of the match twice in his first 5 games for the Larks.

Mike Baker (25) Defender; club captain. A left-footed centre-half with a big presence, Mike transferred to the Larks from Yate Town in 2017. A schoolboy at Bristol Rovers, his other previous clubs include Mangotsfield United and Odd Down.

Alfie Clarke (19) Defender. Alfie rejoins the Larks after spells on loan from Bristol Rovers. A left-sided full back who likes to forge forward.

Josh Jones (23) Defender. An imposing and consistent centre-half, Josh signed for the Larks from Mangotsfield in 2017. He has also played for Clevedon and Cribbs.

Wayne Nderemani (19). Defender/wing back. Wayne is a 2018 signing for the Larks, a tenacious and lively full-back who can also play as a winger. He joined the Larks from the Bath City Academy.

Dan Restorick – (21) Defender/midfield. Dan is a product of the Larkhall u18s side who scored on his first team debut in 2016 and had had a very successful spell in New Zealand last season. He can play at defence or in midfield.

Jaiden Savery (23) Defender. Jaiden has come through the Larks' u-18s and Reserves sides and joins the first team on a dual reg basis with Odd Down.

Our Visitors Today

Tom Warren (31) Defender. A very experienced centre-half, Tom signed from Melksham in November 2019. He was at Mangotsfield for a number of years and has also played for Yate Town.

Geraint Bater (39) Midfielder. Bates is a central midfielder with a fine pedigree who started out at Bristol Rovers and has also played for Newport County as well as a number of Southern League sides. He became the Larks' assistant manager in November 2015, and was first team manager from October 2016-January 2017.

Matt Britton (24) Midfield. Ginge is a robust presence at the heart of the midfield who can also fill in at central defence. He joined the Larks from Western League side Cadbury Heath in 2017. He was our joint second top scorer in his first season.

Jack Camm (26) Midfield. Busy and versatile midfielder Jack makes a welcome return after a few years' absence. He has also played for Yate Town and Cinderford.

Jack Dancey (22) Midfield. Jack is a versatile defender/midfielder whose last club was Whitley Bay. He has also featured for English Colleges and Durham University.

Dale Evans (32) Midfield. Dale is a very experienced and sought after central midfielder who signed in 2019 from Paulton Rovers. Other previous clubs include Mangotsfield Utd, Taunton Town, Yate Town, Cinderford Town and Newport County.

Harry Hope (25). Midfield/forward. A new signing in the 2018-19 season, Harry is an attacking midfielder, strong in possession, who can play as a centre-forward or on the wing. Previous clubs include Cardiff Met University and Nailsea United.

Our Visitors Today

Alex Lambert (28) Midfield. A fast and strong left-sided winger, Alex joined the Larks in 2016 from Brislington where he featured in the side that reached the FA Cup 1st round. Previous clubs also include Mangotsfield United and Yate Town. Second top scorer in the 2017-18 season.

Cory Simpson (26) Midfield/forward. A quick and creative winger, Cory makes a welcome return to the Larks having made a big impression in the 2017-18 season, since when he has played for Salisbury and Evesham United.

Thomas Hillman (19) Forward. Our most recent signing, Tom is a tricky striker who began his career at Newport County before moving to Mangotsfield Utd.

Mitchell Page (31) Centre-forward. A powerful presence in our front line, Mitchell is a very experienced Southern League forward. His previous clubs include Weston-super-Mare, Frome Town, Mangotsfield United, Paulton, and Yate Town. Scored twice in his first three Larks games.

Brad Norris (25) Striker. Hard-working forward Brad returned to the Larks in 2019 after spells at Bath City, Melksham and Frome Town.

Lewis Powell (31) Striker. Lewis is a 2018 signing who needs no introduction to the non-league scene. A proven goal-scorer, after starting his career at Bristol Rovers he also played for Mangotsfield Utd, Taunton Town, Chippenham Town, Weston-super-Mare, and Evesham United. Larks' Golden Boot winner last season.

Our Visitors Today

Charlie Wiles-Richards (18) Striker. Having impressed pre-season, energetic forward Charlie has signed from the Bath City Academy. His dad Shaun played for the Larks for many years.

Management

Phil Bater – manager. Phil enjoyed a tremendous playing career at higher levels, including Bristol Rovers, Brentford, Wrexham and Cardiff City, as well as turning out for Wales u-21s. He has managed a number of clubs, notably Bristol Rovers, Mangotsfield United, and Clevedon. He joined the Larks in January 2017.

Neil Arndale – assistant manager/defender. Arnie joined the Larks as assistant manager from Mangotsfield United in 2015 on the back of a superb career at Bristol Rovers and Cirencester Town (and the England u16 and u18 teams).

Rob York – kit manager. Rob has been a loyal fixture at Plain Ham for many years, as a player, assistant manager of the Reserves, and now kit manager for the 1st team. He knows both the club and the local football scene inside out.

Elise Denner – physio. Elise has a BSc in Sports Rehabilitation and a level 2 certificate in Pre-Hospital Immediate Care in Sport.

Swans throw away first half lead with Jekyll and Hyde performance

Slimbridge dominated much of the first half and if it wasn't for the heroics of home goal keeper Ryan Gosney, the visitors would have been three or four goals up by half time. The Swans gained a corner in the first minute after Rhys Sarson's shot was deflected wide. Will Peck headed the corner goal ward only for Gosney to tip the ball over the bar.

The visitors took the lead on 7 minutes, James Spruce burst into the box and was fouled just as he was about to shoot and awarded a penalty, Jack Horrell stepped up and sent the keeper Gosney the wrong way.

On 16 minutes Ryan Beckinsale hit a 25 yard shot heading just inside the post but again Gosney was there to push the ball around the post to deny the visitors. Two minutes later Beckinsale launched a shot over the bar after a great team move from the middle of the park.

It was then Sarson's turn to test the home keeper, firing a shot destined for the top corner from just outside the box however Gosney somehow got his hand to the ball and tipped it over as the Swans dominated the play. Aaron Nesbeth returning from a long injury layoff found space on the right and delivered a cross into the box for Beckinsale to head straight at Gosney. Spruce then chased a Beckinsale through ball into the box however Gosney managed to block the ball despite cries for a second penalty.

With just over 5 minutes of the first half remaining the Swans were lucky not to concede when Jake Hoole on the left found Lee Wort in space at the back post with a pin point cross. Wort heading the ball against the post and out for a goal kick.

The second half was a completely different game, Sholing came out fired up with the Swans looking like a bunch of strangers on the pitch. An early home side free kick from Alex Sawyer hit the wall as the visitors failed to get into their stride after such a strong first half performance.

Another free kick to the home side 30 yards out on 58 minutes was struck under the wall taking a deflection in the box for Stuart Green to tap into the net past Lewis Adams. With Slimbridge trying to hit the home side on the break with long balls forward, Spruce escaped down the right into space but his effort hit the side netting.

With 15 minutes remaining Sawyer's shot from outside of the box flew over Adams crossbar before Beckinsale's shot flew wide from the edge of the box at the other end. With four minutes remaining Sholing took the lead Wort fired a cross from the right wing into the path of Bradley Targett who made no mistake from 15 yards striking the ball just inside the post out of Adams reach.

To compound a miserable second half for the visitors in injury time, Adams chased the ball as it was being played around the inside of the box by the opposition and was judged to have bundled an opponent over while try to get to the ball. The referee awarding a penalty which was duly dispatched by Daniel Mason. The final play of the game saw Sarson's free kick on the left fly straight into the arms of Gosney.

Our History

In The Beginning

The Gloucestershire village of Slimbridge is world renowned for its Bird Sanctuary, but in recent years much hard work has gone into making Slimbridge better known in football circles.

The Club's history can be traced back to the 1899/1900 season playing in local football at various venues in and around the village. A gap in the records suggests there may have been a couple of seasons when no games were played, and thus, officially, the Club's centenary was celebrated in 2002/03.

It was not until 1951 that the current ground at Wisloe Road was acquired, after a former player, Evi Thornhill, bequeathed it to the Club in his Will. For the next forty-odd years the Club were predominantly members of the Stroud and District League with varying degrees of success and failure, except for a period between 1960 and 1968 when they were in the Gloucester Northern Senior League.

Point Of Collapse

By 1988, a point of collapse approached, but fortunately, a handful of committee members led by Gordon King and Gordon Tudor kept the Club afloat. The following season local businessman Paul Chappell arrived. The Club was stabilised and construction of new changing facilities, to County League standard, were completed.

Start Of A New Reign

As playing standards improved, the building of a long awaited Social Club commenced in the 1998/99 season. The following year saw the introduction of John Mack, a successful local entrepreneur, as Chairman. In the summer of 2001, Doug Gray was appointed Manager.

Our History

After achieving the Runners-up spot in their first season in the Gloucester County League, the club were accepted into the Hellenic League. Hellenic Division One West was won by an eleven point margin in 2002/03 and with it, promotion to the Hellenic Premier Division, where a creditable fourth place finish was achieved in 2003/04. In a marvelous season the club also claimed the Hellenic 'Norman Matthews' Floodlit Cup and the G.F.A. Challenge Trophy.

Arrival Of Floodlights

The summer of 2003 saw the floodlights installed. A pre-season visit from Conference side Forest Green Rovers on 22nd July, produced a then ground record attendance of 427 to witness the inaugural floodlit game at Wisloe Road.

A few weeks later on Sunday 24th August, that ground record was beaten at a Bank Holiday Hellenic Premier Division fixture that was part of the 2003/04 annual 'Ground Hop' weekend. Local rivals Shortwood United provided the opposition in front of a crowd of 525.

Season 2004/05 again saw a fourth place finish in the Hellenic Premier Division, along with a first entry into the F.A. Vase competition which resulted in a useful run to the third round proper before a 2-1 extra time defeat at 'Screwfix' Western League side Backwell United concluded an enjoyable campaign. Sadly, in the February, Gray stood down after nearly four seasons at the helm of the club.

The club started season 2005/06 under newly appointed Manager Doug Foxwell. A first entry into the F.A. cup saw a visit from Wessex League side Wimborne Town.

Our History

A 1-0 defeat did not dampen the sense of occasion on the first day of the season. A second successful run in the F.A. Vase again came to an end in the Third Round Proper, with a 3-1 defeat at South Midland Premier, Welwyn Garden City. After a record-breaking 64 game season, the team managed a fifth place finish in the Hellenic Premier Division. The club also won the Hellenic 'Norman Matthews' Floodlit Cup and the GFA Challenge Trophy, both for the second time in three seasons.

Reserves Make Headway

After two successive third place finishes in the Stroud and District League First Division, season 2005/06 saw the Reserve side finally win the title and with it, promotion to the Gloucester Northern Senior League Division Two. This was the same League title that the first team won in season 1998/99 which proved the springboard for five successive first team promotions.

Rise To New Heights

Season 2006/07 proved the most successful in the Club's history to date, with both the First Team and Reserve side recording League and Cup doubles, with the added bonus of record-breaking F. A. Cup and Vase runs for the senior side as well.

In the F.A. Cup, a five match run from the Extra-Preliminary Round finished at Merthyr Tydfil in the Third Qualifying Round. Along the way there were memorable wins against two other Southern Premier sides, 2-1 at Yate Town and 3-1 at home to Chippenham Town.

It was six matches in the F.A. Vase before defeat was tasted, the run ending in the Fifth Round Proper at home to the eventual winners, Truro City.

Our History

In the Hellenic Premier Division, a solid start was established. Due to the Cup runs, and then bad weather, which led to a record number of postponements during the subsequently extended season, half a seasons fixtures had to be played in the final two months. A tremendous effort saw the Club bring the Championship Shield to Wisloe Road, the winning margin being three points over second placed North Leigh.

There was a rousing performance in the G.F.A. Trophy Final against Almondsbury Town. A 3-1 victory not only retained the Trophy, but recorded a third success in four seasons in that competition.

The Reserve side had an early success in the Gloucester Northern Senior League Cup with a 2-0 win against Division One Tuffley Rovers. This saw confidence rise and they went on to break a Gloucestershire Northern Senior League record in winning Division Two with a Played 30, Won 30 record.

Promotion To The Southern League

Alongside the playing success, progress in the improvement of facilities allowed the First Team to be accepted into the BGB Southern League Division One Midlands for Season 2007/08, the highest level that the Club have ever operated at.

Return To A New Beginning

On July 10th 2007 the club decided not to take up the opportunity of playing in the BGB Southern League Division One Midlands for Season 2007/08, instead the club reverted back to the Gloucester Northern Senior League. This meant a big upheaval in the club both on and off the field with the manager Doug Foxwell and several senior players moving on the pastures new.

Our History

However a loyal band of players stayed on including James Cole taking over as player manager with assistance from long term club captain Leon Sterling.

Climb Back Up The Ladder

Four promotions followed as the club regained their previous status. The reins were handed over to Leon Sterling, who moved into the Manager's role, joined by Assistant and long time Slimbridge stalwart Freddy Ward. The two have guided the side to a very respectable sixth and fifth place in their first two seasons back in the Hellenic Premier.

Switching Leagues

After three top six finishes in the Hellenic Premier League, The Swans applied for a transfer to the Toolstation Western Premier League, a move approved by the FA in the Summer of 2013.

Return To The Southern League

After two seasons in the Toolstation Western Premier League, a third place finish at the end of the 2014/15 season gave the Swans a second opportunity to return to the Southern Football League. This time the club accepted the offer and took their place in the South and West division finishing a credible 18th.

Welcome To Thornhill Park

At the start of the 2016-17 season prior to our annual freindly fixture with neighbours Forest Green Rovers, the football ground in Wisloe Road was renamed in honour of the gift in 1960 from former Chairman Evi Thornhill of the land the club still occupies to this day.

Our History

Evi's son, Tony and his wife Margaret were on hand to cut the ceremonial ribbon, and Tony made a short heartfelt speech about how much the renaming meant to him and the entire Thornhill family, and how honoured they were that the football club had recognised their father in this way.

Changes On The Bench

After a run of poor results the club parted company with manager Leon Sterling in December 2016, his assistant Freddy Ward taking up the post initially on a caretaker basis. Freddy continued in the role for the following season bringing in Lee Driver-Dickerson as his assistant and former Gloucester City player Lee Smith as player coach.

After tough year, just avoiding relegation Freddy Ward stepped down as first team manager at the end of the 2017/18 season. Driver-Dickerson taking up the reigns with Cheltenham youth coach Dave Strain as his assistant.

Progression Through Youth

After three tough years of survival in the Southern League the committee decided to start a new Under 18's team, entering into the Midland Floodlit Youth League, Division 1 for the 2018/19 season. The aim was to produce a new crop of Swans to bolster the first team and provide a platform for local players to progress into Southern League Football

The move was a resounding success, seven of the Under 18 players stepping up to first team football during the season and Lewis Adams taking the number one jersey for the majority of the season.

Our History

Another step forward

At the start of the 2019/20 season the clubs fifth in the Southern League, further progress is being made on the pitch. Alex Lumsden an academy coach at Bristol Rovers and former Swansea player Dion Chambers joining Lee Driver-Dickerson's backroom staff.

The Under 18's have moved across to a new County based youth league and the formation of an Under 17 team to bolster the clubs youthful squad gives an exciting air to the future of the club.
