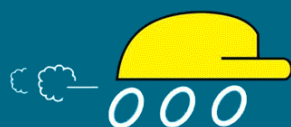

Our Visitors Today

The 2019/20 season is Mangotsfield's 20th campaign as a Southern League club. This is their eleventh season in the BetVictor Southern - (Division One South), previously finishing 9th in 2009/10, 3rd in 2010/11, (but losing the play-off semi-final, 1-3 to Frome Town), 14th in 2011/12, 13th in 2012/13, 11th in 2013/14, 10th in 2014/15, 14th in 2015/16, 8th in 2016/17, & 16th in both 2017/18 and 2018/19. The Board of Directors comprises, Mike Richardson as Chairman, & Pete Crowley as Director of Football Club Development.

There has been football in the village since 1888 and four years later, Mangotsfield FC became a founder member of the Bristol & District League (later to become the Western Football League in 1895) but the club folded after 10 years. From 1898 until the 1950s, Mangotsfield FC was disbanded and subsequently reformed on several occasions. In January 1951, the parent club dispensed with the Reserve X1 for financial reasons leaving many local players without a team to play for. These players decided to form a new club in the village and at the start of the 1951-52 season, the newly-established Mangotsfield United FC was entered into the Bristol & District League, Division VII. They achieved five successive promotions and gained entry to the Bristol & District Premier Combination in 1957. The club remained there until 1972-73, when it was accepted in to the Western League.

The Club became established in the Western League during the 1970's and despite being relegated to the first division in 1981-82, **"The Field"**, as they were affectionately known, bounced straight back the following season and under the guidance of the charismatic Ralph Miller, who as Chairman, undertook the task of improving the ground and its facilities, became a force in the Premier, mainly featuring in the leading positions.

In 1991, the club, managed by Harold Jarman and assisted by Terry Rowles, achieved regional glory by taking the (then) Great Mills League Premier Division title, ahead of runners-up Torrington. Disappointingly, they were denied promotion to the Southern League as their ground failed to meet the grading requirements and there followed several lean seasons as the team disbanded. Under newly-elected Chairman Richard Davis, however, off the pitch, things were improving.

Terry Rowles returned to manage the club himself in 1995 and kept them in the spotlight by consistently finishing in the top three/four in the Great Mills/Screwfix League and an appearance in the FA Vase semi-final (losing to Clitheroe), but their ambitions of promotion and Southern League football were always thwarted by the continual success of Taunton and Tiverton Town. It was considered very important to establish a sound working base, improve ground facilities and secure a long-term tenure on their Cossham Street ground.

In earlier years, the Roger Pullin / Richard Davis partnership had seen many improvements take place, with the installation of Conference-style floodlights and at the end of the 2003/04 season, the Cossham Street end of the ground was covered, together with new toilet blocks and social club improvements. Ex player Andy Black returned to the club as Manager in 1999 and guided the club to promotion to the Dr. Martens Southern League and three successful campaigns. The 2003/04 campaign did not go too well and just before Christmas, Black was replaced by Martyn Grimshaw. Towards the end of the campaign, Nigel Webb came in as his Assistant, but the club could only finish in 13th place, which was not high enough for the planned restructuring of the Pyramid.

The Management duo made promotion their priority in 2004/05 and the club headed the table for most of the campaign, eventually taking the Division One West title with a 21 match unbeaten run. After 28 seasons at Western League level, the club had spent just five campaigns at Southern League level before reaching the Premier Division. The club have looked for financial stability in recent years, with the need to reach out to the community and attract a broader fan-base and local sponsorship. There has been some success in that area with the Cossham Street ground currently named **The KPI LIMITED STADIUM**.

Sometimes now referred to as “**The Mangos**”, the 2019/20 campaign, continues with **Ollie Price** at the helm together with **Neil Simons** as Assistant Manager & **Kerry Georgiou** as Head Coach. They started in a caretaker capacity in the latter half of the 2017/18 campaign. Their immediate aim is to stabilise the club, linking it to the SGS College and a re-introduction of the Youth team, and eventually return to the Southern Football League, Premier Division, where they spent four seasons from 2005-2009, finishing 10th, 9th, 14th and 22nd.

OLIVER (OLLIE) PRICE – MANAGER

Ollie took on the Managerial post permanently for 2018/19, after acting as caretaker in the latter half of 2017/18. He returned to Cossham Street from Frome Town, at the start of 2017/18, after he played for three seasons for us (04/05-06/07) making 88(11) appearances and scoring 5 goals. He originally signed in May 2004 from Clevedon Town where he made 139 appearances, having signed for them from Exeter City in July 2001. He was at St. James Park as a YTS player before being surprisingly released. Formed a strong partnership with Gary Warren at Cossham Street, and has also played for Paulton Rovers, Yate & Larkhall.

NEIL SIMONS – ASSISTANT MANAGER

Joined Mangotsfield Utd as Assistant Manager in December 2018. He was successful as Manager at Chipping Sodbury Town and has a good knowledge of Western League and all local football. He is professional in his approach and has a good understanding of the game.

KERRY GEORGIU – HEAD COACH

Holds a UEFA B Licence. He has been coaching at Cheltenham Town Academy for 3 years, and for 4 years with Bristol City Academy. He played for Rockleze and coached their U18s and first team.

RUSS GREGORY – ASSISTANT COACH

Starting his third season with us, now as Assistant Coach. He is already at FA Level 1 coaching and working his way towards level two. He has also qualified his FA courses for Talent ID and Scouting, Psychology, Emergency Aid and Safeguarding. Since joining us during last season, he has become a valued member of the Coaching staff with a good knowledge of the non-league scene, especially at Youth level.

JOHN HOUSE – MATCHDAY ASSISTANT / KIT

John is a valuable member of the management team, and a true clubman. Helping on pitch preparation, kit, match-balls etc. He has been at the club for over eighteen years, and in earlier times, was a big help to Pat McKeown with the Reserves. He played Western league football in his playing days and has appeared for Cadbury Heath & Oldland, amongst others.

TERRY ROSE – MATCHDAY ASSISTANT/CO-ORDINATOR

Now a sprightly 74, Terry was a huge Bristol City fan, watching them in their brief flirtation with the old First Division, and a regular season-ticket holder. When they fell away from those dizzy heights, he started watching Mangotsfield United, and when he retired from HGV driving in 2011, he started to help the club out on match days. His help has been invaluable and you may recall that his grandson Nathan was briefly with the club three season's ago.

MARKO RADOVANOVIC - GOALKEEPER

Australian keeper, 29 year old, signed from Cirencester Town for the last six games of 2018/19. He has also played at Gloucester City & Hereford and looks to have made the number one jersey is very own. He played for Yaralla, Clinton & The Capricorn Tigers in the Senior grade 'down under', and was playing for Liverton in the S/W Peninsula League, before signing for Hereford in February 2019.

SEKANI SIMPSON – DEFENDER

Back with us for a 2nd campaign, Sekani was previously with Clevedon, having joined them from Weston-super-Mare in November 2016. Started his career as a youth with Bristol City and had spells with Forest Green Rovers and Tamworth before joining Bath City. He made 376 apps for The Romans in almost 10 years and joined Weston in March 2016. Made 36 apps for Mangos last term.

TREYVOND ANDERSON – DEFENDER

Born Bristol, a very versatile player who joined Yate Town in July 2016, Trey is a product of Bristol Rovers Academy. He joined Clevedon Town in January 2015, and then played for Lex X1 in the Cymru Alliance during 2015-16. Ended last season at Paulton Rovers.

MATTY TANNER – DEFENDER

Born in Bath, had been attending South Gloucestershire & Stroud College, he was signed from Bristol Manor Farm, who he joined in the summer from Yate Town. He has appeared previously for Reading FC, Swindon Town, Bradford Town & Melksham Town. Proved to be a key player at Cossham Street as the season progressed.

TOBY RENNIE – DEFENDER

A defender who was with Bristol Rovers from the age of 13, but was released in the early part of 2017, when he joined Yate Town.

LEWIS DIX – DEFENDER

Young Full-back, signed '*on loan*' from Chippenham Town Academy. He has shown to have ability and potential and has impressed in pre-season.

MIRCEA LLEA – CENTRE-HALF

Romanian born, aka as 'Big Mike', he has come through the SGS College system and showed up well at Hengrove Athletic. A no-nonsense style of defender, who needs to test himself at Southern League level.

LEE HARTSHORN – DEFENDER/ STRIKER

32 year old, Welsh born defender who signed from Bradford Town last season. Has great experience in Welsh leagues with Merthyr Tydfil/Town, Llanelli, Newton AFC & Afan Lido. He scored three goals for us from his 15(1) appearances in 2018/19, after switching from defence to attack and we are hopeful of his continued improvement over the coming campaign.

KEITH KEARNEY – CENTRAL DEFENDER

Northern Ireland Under 17/19s International defender Keith Kearney signed from Cribbs in the latter stages of last season. He has also played for Rochdale and only recently relocated to Bristol. He was captain at International level. He netted three times in 6 appearances.

COLIN MUGOYA-TABINGWA

21 year old, Centre or right-back, who has returned following a successful 2018/19. Over the last few seasons or so, had been with Hayes & Yeading United, but had brief spells with Bracknell Town, Burnham and Clapton. He is a character in the dressing room with his dance moves and funny accents. Just loves to defend. Made 26(7) apps last season. Always gives 100%.

CLAYTON FORTUNE - DEFENDER/MIDFIELD

Experienced defender, who can also play in midfield. Returns to Mangos after a successful 2018/19. Started his career with Bristol City, & Tottenham Youth and spent time with Aldershot, Port Vale, Leyton Orient, Darlington, Rushden & Diamonds, Weston-super-Mare, & Hereford United. He was also with Clevedon Town, where he was a player and A/Manager. Has 34(10) apps, and one goal to his name with Mangotsfield.

DAN DEMKIV – ATTACKING MIDFIELDER

22 year old Dan was with Southampton from U7s to U18s. He joined Salisbury, then Nuneaton Town before joining Cirencester Town. Born in Bath, he moved on to Melksham Town, Frome Town & Westbury United. Joined Mangotsfield United in December 2018. Won the Young Player of the season award. Made 22(1) apps, scoring 5 goals and becoming a fan favourite.

ASHLEY McGRANE – MIDFIELD

Signed from Odd Down FC during the summer of 2019. Last season's Supporters' POTS and leading scorer.

DOMINIC BROAD – CENTRAL MIDFIELD

Vastly experienced player aged 32. Played in the Welsh Football League and as a youngster was at WBA & Leicester City. He has recently been a successful Player/Manager at Pontypridd Town.

JOSEPH HALL – MIDFIELDER

18 year old who was on loan from Bristol City, last season but has now joined us permanently. He made 6(4) apps in 2018/19, scoring once, and made a big impact to our end of season form.

CALUM FERGUSON – MIDFIELDER

21 year old right-sided midfielder, who joined during January 2019 from Highworth Town. He is a confident player with good technical ability, and with a little more consistency, we should see the best of him this season.

JAKE THOMAS – WIDE MIDFIELD

Has returned after a promising 2018/19, when he scored 2 goals from 3(10) apps. Has the potential to be a success but needs more self belief.

LEWIS SAUNDERS – ATTACKING MIDFIELD

A player who has come through the SGS Academy system. He has returned following a successful spell in America. Gives us an extra added attacking dimension.

TOM HILLMAN: - WING BACK

A tricky winger who joined us in the later stages of last season on a work experience loan from Newport County. Made his Newport debut in the Checktrade Trophy against Cheltenham Town. He found the nets for us on four occasions from 10 (2) appearances. Good delivery from set pieces. Clever player with a superb delivery at free-kicks and corners.

BRANDON FEEHELY – STRIKER

Signed from Hengrove Athletic during summer of 2019. Can play wide or down through the middle. Has pace to burn.

BEN BROOKS – STRIKER

Born Newport, starting his career with County, he has rejoined Mangotsfield for a second spell. Previously with us in 2015/16, he left us for Larkhall Athletic and joined Yate during 2017/18, where he proved he could score at Southern League Level. He has the necessary pace and could be just the striker needed at Cossham Street. Also played at Bitton for a spell.

ROBBIE COX – STRIKER

Joined from Portishead in the summer of 2019, and after several seasons of showing great promise, has challenged himself to do well in Southern League football.

SACHA TONG – STRIKER

A player who needs to test himself at Southern League level, after scoring regularly at Cadbury Heath. He was previously at Yate Town, but was sidelined by a serious wrist injury. Has shown up well in pre-season with several goals.

LIAM BISHOP – FORWARD

Another player who has been signed '*on loan*' from Hereford FC. Impressed in pre-season, finding the net at Kidlington.

Swans ease to first league victory

Slimbridge manager Lee Driver-Dickerson made four changes to the side that faced Evesham in mid-week. 17 year-old Joe Wright taking over from the injured Lewis Adams in goal and a re-shuffle at the back saw Mike Ford and Joel Letori starting alongside Ioan Richards returning to the club on dual registration with Gloucester City, Tyrone Tucker-Dixon also starting his first game for the club up front.

Basingstoke started brightly gaining a free kick after 3 minutes, the initial kick was blocked by the new look Swans defence and the follow up curled wide.

Adam Bloomfield who caused the visitors all sorts of trouble during the game with his pace broke to offside trap and a last ditch tackle gained the home side a corner for his efforts.

Swans exit FA Cup in penalty showdown

Slimbridge made the long mid-week trip to Slough to face Burnham in an FA Cup preliminary round replay. Joe Wright continued in goal with Will Peck returning after missing last weekend's home victory and Christien Turner taking a spot on the bench after being ruled out of the game just before kick-off due to illness.

The first half was a very cagy affair but sides trying to hit each other on the break and keeping the ball on the deck. Dan Molloy hit the side netting early on with a cheeky back heel after collecting a cross from the left.

With seconds to go Wanjau-Smith hit the side netting meaning the game finished level sending the cup tie into 30 minutes of extra time. With both sides still trying to find an opening it was Slimbridge that struck first 10 minutes into extra time, the ball falling to substitute Jack Horrell 35 yards out on the left as it bounced Horrell let fly a screamer into the top of the net leaving the home side stunned.

Burnham continued to pile pressure on the visitors as they had all game and within 2 minutes of the second period of extra time they were level again. Sam Coles breaking through the Slimbridge defence and then out foxing Wright (also only 17) to tuck the ball into the net. It was Burnham that looked more likely to score a second as the clock ran out and sent the tie into a penalty shoot-out.

Swans win big on the road

Our History

In The Beginning

The Gloucestershire village of Slimbridge is world renowned for its Bird Sanctuary, but in recent years much hard work has gone into making Slimbridge better known in football circles.

The Club's history can be traced back to the 1899/1900 season playing in local football at various venues in and around the village. A gap in the records suggests there may have been a couple of seasons when no games were played, and thus, officially, the Club's centenary was celebrated in 2002/03.

It was not until 1951 that the current ground at Wisloe Road was acquired, after a former player, Evi Thornhill, bequeathed it to the Club in his Will. For the next forty-odd years the Club were predominantly members of the Stroud and District League with varying degrees of success and failure, except for a period between 1960 and 1968 when they were in the Gloucester Northern Senior League.

Point Of Collapse

By 1988, a point of collapse approached, but fortunately, a handful of committee members led by Gordon King and Gordon Tudor kept the Club afloat. The following season local businessman Paul Chappell arrived. The Club was stabilised and construction of new changing facilities, to County League standard, were completed.

Start Of A New Reign

As playing standards improved, the building of a long awaited Social Club commenced in the 1998/99 season. The following year saw the introduction of John Mack, a successful local entrepreneur, as Chairman. In the summer of 2001, Doug Gray was appointed Manager.

Our History

After achieving the Runners-up spot in their first season in the Gloucester County League, the club were accepted into the Hellenic League. Hellenic Division One West was won by an eleven point margin in 2002/03 and with it, promotion to the Hellenic Premier Division, where a creditable fourth place finish was achieved in 2003/04. In a marvelous season the club also claimed the Hellenic 'Norman Matthews' Floodlit Cup and the G.F.A. Challenge Trophy.

Arrival Of Floodlights

The summer of 2003 saw the floodlights installed. A pre-season visit from Conference side Forest Green Rovers on 22nd July, produced a then ground record attendance of 427 to witness the inaugural floodlit game at Wisloe Road.

A few weeks later on Sunday 24th August, that ground record was beaten at a Bank Holiday Hellenic Premier Division fixture that was part of the 2003/04 annual 'Ground Hop' weekend. Local rivals Shortwood United provided the opposition in front of a crowd of 525.

Season 2004/05 again saw a fourth place finish in the Hellenic Premier Division, along with a first entry into the F.A. Vase competition which resulted in a useful run to the third round proper before a 2-1 extra time defeat at 'Screwfix' Western League side Backwell United concluded an enjoyable campaign. Sadly, in the February, Gray stood down after nearly four seasons at the helm of the club.

The club started season 2005/06 under newly appointed Manager Doug Foxwell. A first entry into the F.A. cup saw a visit from Wessex League side Wimborne Town.

Our History

A 1-0 defeat did not dampen the sense of occasion on the first day of the season. A second successful run in the F.A. Vase again came to an end in the Third Round Proper, with a 3-1 defeat at South Midland Premier, Welwyn Garden City. After a record-breaking 64 game season, the team managed a fifth place finish in the Hellenic Premier Division. The club also won the Hellenic 'Norman Matthews' Floodlit Cup and the GFA Challenge Trophy, both for the second time in three seasons.

Reserves Make Headway

After two successive third place finishes in the Stroud and District League First Division, season 2005/06 saw the Reserve side finally win the title and with it, promotion to the Gloucester Northern Senior League Division Two. This was the same League title that the first team won in season 1998/99 which proved the springboard for five successive first team promotions.

Rise To New Heights

Season 2006/07 proved the most successful in the Club's history to date, with both the First Team and Reserve side recording League and Cup doubles, with the added bonus of record-breaking F. A. Cup and Vase runs for the senior side as well.

In the F.A. Cup, a five match run from the Extra-Preliminary Round finished at Merthyr Tydfil in the Third Qualifying Round. Along the way there were memorable wins against two other Southern Premier sides, 2-1 at Yate Town and 3-1 at home to Chippenham Town.

It was six matches in the F.A. Vase before defeat was tasted, the run ending in the Fifth Round Proper at home to the eventual winners, Truro City.

Our History

In the Hellenic Premier Division, a solid start was established. Due to the Cup runs, and then bad weather, which led to a record number of postponements during the subsequently extended season, half a seasons fixtures had to be played in the final two months. A tremendous effort saw the Club bring the Championship Shield to Wisloe Road, the winning margin being three points over second placed North Leigh.

There was a rousing performance in the G.F.A. Trophy Final against Almondsbury Town. A 3-1 victory not only retained the Trophy, but recorded a third success in four seasons in that competition.

The Reserve side had an early success in the Gloucester Northern Senior League Cup with a 2-0 win against Division One Tuffley Rovers. This saw confidence rise and they went on to break a Gloucestershire Northern Senior League record in winning Division Two with a Played 30, Won 30 record.

Promotion To The Southern League

Alongside the playing success, progress in the improvement of facilities allowed the First Team to be accepted into the BGB Southern League Division One Midlands for Season 2007/08, the highest level that the Club have ever operated at.

Return To A New Beginning

On July 10th 2007 the club decided not to take up the opportunity of playing in the BGB Southern League Division One Midlands for Season 2007/08, instead the club reverted back to the Gloucester Northern Senior League. This meant a big upheaval in the club both on and off the field with the manager Doug Foxwell and several senior players moving on the pastures new.

Our History

However a loyal band of players stayed on including James Cole taking over as player manager with assistance from long term club captain Leon Sterling.

Climb Back Up The Ladder

Four promotions followed as the club regained their previous status. The reins were handed over to Leon Sterling, who moved into the Manager's role, joined by Assistant and long time Slimbridge stalwart Freddy Ward. The two have guided the side to a very respectable sixth and fifth place in their first two seasons back in the Hellenic Premier.

Switching Leagues

After three top six finishes in the Hellenic Premier League, The Swans applied for a transfer to the Toolstation Western Premier League, a move approved by the FA in the Summer of 2013.

Return To The Southern League

After two seasons in the Toolstation Western Premier League, a third place finish at the end of the 2014/15 season gave the Swans a second opportunity to return to the Southern Football League. This time the club accepted the offer and took their place in the South and West division finishing a credible 18th.

Welcome To Thornhill Park

At the start of the 2016-17 season prior to our annual freindly fixture with neighbours Forest Green Rovers, the football ground in Wisloe Road was renamed in honour of the gift in 1960 from former Chairman Evi Thornhill of the land the club still occupies to this day.

Our History

Evi's son, Tony and his wife Margaret were on hand to cut the ceremonial ribbon, and Tony made a short heartfelt speech about how much the renaming meant to him and the entire Thornhill family, and how honoured they were that the football club had recognised their father in this way.

Changes On The Bench

After a run of poor results the club parted company with manager Leon Sterling in December 2016, his assistant Freddy Ward taking up the post initially on a caretaker basis. Freddy continued in the role for the following season bringing in Lee Driver-Dickerson as his assistant and former Gloucester City player Lee Smith as player coach.

After tough year, just avoiding relegation Freddy Ward stepped down as first team manager at the end of the 2017/18 season. Driver-Dickerson taking up the reigns with Cheltenham youth coach Dave Strain as his assistant.

Progression Through Youth

After three tough years of survival in the Southern League the committee decided to start a new Under 18's team, entering into the Midland Floodlit Youth League, Division 1 for the 2018/19 season. The aim was to produce a new crop of Swans to bolster the first team and provide a platform for local players to progress into Southern League Football

The move was a resounding success, seven of the Under 18 players stepping up to first team football during the season and Lewis Adams taking the number one jersey for the majority of the season.

Our History

Another step forward

At the start of the 2019/20 season the clubs fifth in the Southern League, further progress is being made on the pitch. Alex Lumsden an academy coach at Bristol Rovers and former Swansea player Dion Chambers joining Lee Driver-Dickerson's backroom staff.

The Under 18's have moved across to a new County based youth league and the formation of an Under 17 team to bolster the clubs youthful squad gives an exciting air to the future of the club.
