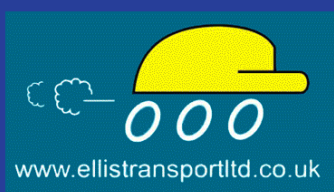

Our Visitors Today

Cirencester Town FC was formed in 1889 and played amateur football in the Cirencester & District League, Cheltenham League and eventually the Gloucestershire Northern Senior League.

In the late '60s Cirencester joined the Gloucester County League, moving from there up to the Hellenic League in 1969. During that time they had their first national cup run, reaching the 2nd round proper of the FA Amateur Cup. They won their first major piece of silverware, taking the Hellenic First Division Championship in 1973-74 to reach the Premier Division. Following a subsequent relegation the modern phase of development was slowly established, with their Smithsfield ground being improved.

Runners up to Cinderford Town in '90-'91 put the club back in the Hellenic Premier, and they also picked up the Hellenic League First Division Challenge Cup for the first time as well as the Gloucestershire Senior Amateur Cup (North). Premier Division Runners up '91 – 92 behind Shortwood United in the Premier Division, they also lost 2-1 to Shortwood United in the GFA Challenge Trophy Final, but bagged that season's Arthur Shipway Cup.

Season 1995-96 was the start of the new era. In partnership with Cirencester College, the club began the groundbreaking Football Academy programme. Developing rapidly, first under Dave Hockaday and when he moved as Youth Team Manager to Watford FC, followed by Steve Lowndes, the Academy have been National College Champions in '97 and in '98, five times winners of the English Schools FA U19 Colleges Cup since 1998, and British Colleges Trophy Champions 4 times since '97.

The youngsters have regularly reached the latter stages of the FA Youth Cup as the last remaining non-league club in that competition and in 2008-09 reached the third round proper before losing to Sunderland at the Stadium of Light. The success of the Academy has had the knock on effect of providing CTFC with new blood and developing talent.

Off field, a long planning process led to the development of the Community Club phase led by Chairman Steve Abbley and implemented over 3 years by Business Manager Anna Kocherhan. In summer 2002 Brian Hughes succeeded Ray Baverstock as manager. At the same time the club, having invested the proceeds of the sale of Smithsfield in the Corinium Stadium at Kingshill, moved into their new facility and renamed as "The Centurions". This development was followed in November 2004 by the opening of The Arena, a state of the art full size indoor training facility. We have now been awarded the FA's "Charter Standard Community Club" status and this summer we received the 2006 Gloucestershire FA Award for "Charter Standard Community Club of the Year", which was presented to Steve Abbley by Sir Geoff Hurst.

The Junior section of the club, with its philosophy of "football for all" and which has in the region of 300 members, is of vital importance to the club and with a thriving Ladies team in addition to the Men's first team, the club really does provide a valuable service to the local community. With the Arena hosting approximately 70 teams in its 5-a-side and 6-a-side football leagues, and the Club being a thriving private and corporate event venue, the future of the Club is assured.

In May 2006, after four highly successful years and having raised expectations at the club, Brian Hughes resigned as First Team Manager to be replaced by Neil Hards. Neil had taken a year out of football after his achievements at Winchester City where they gained “back to back” promotions and won the FA Vase in 2004. Unfortunately, despite some good early performances, the team lacked the necessary consistency, and a disastrous run of results after Christmas meant they finished in the relegation places. However the club was later reprieved from relegation after a number of changes were made to club allocations in the non-league structure due to club mergers and other decisions.

Manager Adi Viveash left the Centurions to take up his role as Chelsea and Brian Hughes was again called upon to take up the hot seat as First Team manager. The 2009 – 10 season proved to be a very successful one with the Development squad winning the league in their first season and the first team gaining promotion via the play offs after 2 very good away wins both with late goals.

Manager Brian Hughes managed the clubs first season back in the Premier Division in 2010-2011 and the club finished 13th. Unfortunately 2011-12 saw the heartbreak of relegation and our first year back in the South & West division saw us finish a respectable 10th in the table

2013-2014 saw the club have its most successful season ever gaining automatic promotion back to the Southern League Premier by clinching the title on the last day of the season to beat Merthyr Town to the championship. Brian Hughes worked with a small squad which managed to overturn a 9 point deficit and clinched the title last term by winning the last 7 games of the season whilst everyone else dropped points on the way.

2016-2017 saw changes at the helm after a poor start Brian Hughes was relieved of the manager's job and Charlie Griffin was installed as his replacement. The 2017-2018 saw a brand-new state of the art 3G pitch installed at The Corinium Stadium. After a slow start The Centurions missed out on a playoff spot on goal difference and disappointment was to follow last season after finishing runners up, promotion was denied via the play offs losing to Cinderford Town FC in the semi-final by 1 goal.

December 2019 saw another change with former North Leigh manager John Brough take the helm replacing Charlie Griffin after a disappointing start to the season. The change nearly had the desired effect as the Centurions climbed the table with a play off place in sight before the season was sadly cut short due to the current situation, we find ourselves in relating to COVID 19.

Sadly, due to the COVID-19 pandemic the last two seasons have been written with The Centurions pushing for promotion on each occasion. With the curtailment of last season we found ourselves 5 points clear at the top of the league despite only playing 9 games but alas, it was not to be and hopefully 2021-22 will be a better season all round.....for all non league clubs

Alex Harris - Goalkeeper

Big and strong goalkeeper who commands his box and is quick off the line. Summer signing from Merthyr Town and has won the Southern League previously with Cinderford Town FC. Great shot stopper and a great addition to the club.

Shayne Anson– Defender

‘Sheriff’ returned to the Corinium last season for his second spell following a few seasons away. After a brief foray into management at Tuffley Rovers he put the boots back on representing Evesham before rejoining the Centurions once again last season. Excellent defender with pace to burn.

Thomas Handley– Defender

Another player that joins us from the Jubilee Stadium having previously spent time at The Corinium. Left sided defender who despite his young age has bags of experience at Southern league level.

Jordan Morris – Defender

Signed from Forest Green Rovers as a winger but converted to full back and was one of last season outstanding performers. Pace to burn and great on the ball at the back.

Ellis Dunton – Defender

Ellis returns to the Corinium after a season away at neighbours Fairford Town, having previously been at Cirencester since the age of 6 years old and coming through our Academy system. Big commanding centre half.

Josh Nelmes – Defender

Signed from Bristol Manor Farm mid-way through last season and was a great acquisition who looked at home from the outset. Solid centre half who scores his fair share of goals and another previous league winner with Cinderford Town FC.

Nick Peare– Midfielder

Summer signing from Yate Town. Versatile player that is equally as comfortable playing in defence or midfield and scorer of some spectacular goals from set pieces.

Joe Shepherd – Midfielder

Box to box midfielder who joined last season from our neighbors Swindon Supermarine. Joe was originally a product of our football Academy and returns after several years away.

Michael Pook – Midfielder (Player /Coach)

Michael began his career with the Swindon Town Youth system. He went on to make 109 first team appearances for the club. He also played for Cheltenham Town (where he once scored a hat-trick in an amazing 6-5 win V Burton Albion), Oxford City, Maidenhead United and Chippenham Town. A classy, clever, precise midfielder who can unlock defences with a telling pass.

Tommy Anderson – Midfielder

Signed originally from Forest Green Rovers and now in his third full season at Ciren. Pacey, tricky winger that terrorises defences with his direct running. Can be a match winner of his day and a definite fans favourite!

Barnstaple Town 3-2 Slimbridge

Southern League Div. One South

Saturday 29th January 2022

The Swans returned from their third trip to Devon in a fortnight with another road defeat, this time at the hands of Barnstaple Town. After taking the lead through Will Hawes, three goals from the home side put them in control, and Nathan Dennis' late effort was merely a consolation.

It was the visitors who made the better start on a very poor condition pitch, with Myron Turner and Will Hawes both having early chances, while at the other end, Lewis Adams made a good double save from Owen Howe with 12 minutes on the clock. It was still the Swans who were making the running though, and Marley Thomas was unlucky not to get on the end of a couple of scrambles in the Barnstaple box as the visitors pushed for an opener.

On 22 minutes, Myron Turner was fouled on the edge of the Barnstaple box, but Hawes' free kick was wide of the target.

Two minutes later though, the deadlock was broken - Thomas' cross from the right flank was met by Hawes, who guided it past Barnstaple Keeper Lloyd Irish to put the Swans ahead.

Barnstaple replied almost immediately - a mix up at the back as the ball was played into the box saw Howe collide with Lewis Adams, and the referee awarded a spot kick to the home side. Howe picked himself up to convert and level the scores.

Despite the setback, Slimbridge continued to make the better chances - Thomas forced another save from Irish before Ben McLean saw his effort saved when one on one with the keeper.

There was still time for Thomas to go close with another effort, but the teams went in level at the half.

Barnstaple came out firing at the start of the second period, and took the lead four minutes into the half - After Adams had made a good save from Harry Baker, from the resulting corner, Brodie Montague was allowed far too much space in the box to convert the ball as it came across.

With 52 minutes on the clock, a neat move involving Turner and Hawes saw an effort from Rio Tomlin go close, but three minutes later, Owen Howe picked up his second goal of the match with a drive from outside the box to put the hosts two goals to the good.

Slimbridge continued to create chances with McLean, Nathan Dennis and Hawes all having efforts on goal, but Barnstaple were content to sit back and play out time.

With two minutes remaining, Dennis pulled a goal back for the Swans, heading home from a corner, but it was too little too late.

Slimbridge 2-0 Evesham United **Southern League Div. One South** Wednesday 2nd February 2022

Swans Manager Tom Speers professed himself delighted to see his side complete a League double over their local rivals with a dominant display at Thornhill Park, in front of the club's biggest home gate of the season. A goal in each half from Nathan Dennis and Will Hawes saw the Swans home, and Speers challenged his players after the game to maintain their momentum.

'I was disappointed not to pick up any points at Barnstaple (Last Saturday)' Speers said, 'But tonight - that the minimum we should be - I've talked before about us being Jekyll and Hyde, and we were definitely Hyde tonight, and this is the level we need to stay at - we've got 3 or 4 really big games coming up - if we keep on putting the level of desire, grit, determination and hard work, we have got quality on the pitch and now with an extra player at the back and up top, it makes us a much more dangerous side.'

Given the personnel moves between the two clubs this season, it was no surprise that the game had a feisty start, and it only took twelve minutes for the first booking - Nathan Dennis seeing yellow for a crunching tackle on Toumani Sidebe. Just prior to that, the game's first real chance had gone to the home side, when Jack Spark and Marley Thomas combined well, but there was no-one in the box to meet Thomas' cross as it flashed crossed goal.

Slimbridge also had the next big chance, after Myron Turner played in Will Hawes, who was felled on the edge of the Evesham box, but Hawes subsequent free kick was just off target.

Jordan Lynn's header wide on 19 minutes was the sum of the attacking efforts from the visitors, who were struggling to get a handle for themselves in the game.

With 26 minutes gone, the home side took the lead - A Thomas Free Kick was drifted in from the Swans' left hand side, and Nathan Dennis was on hand to guide the ball past Evesham Keeper Lewis Clayton.

As Slimbridge pressed for a second Turner was just wide with an effort, and Turner played in Thomas just before the break, who was one on one with the keeper, only to see Clayton pull off good block with his feet to keep the deficit to one goal at the half.

The second half began with more Slimbridge pressure - Ben McLean was unlucky not to get on the end of another Thomas cross, and Thomas himself was still causing problems with his speed, nearly fashioning another opportunity running onto a through ball that Clayton reached just ahead of him.

After a Mike Symons effort for Evesham that didn't trouble Swans Keeper Lewis Adams, Slimbridge doubled their lead on 58 minutes.

A move down the Evesham left saw Ben Pricor scuff a clearance, with the ball falling straight to Will Hawes. Hawes took his time and slid the ball past past Clayton to notch the second of the game.

As the Evesham defence tried to regroup, another mix up saw Hawes have another fine effort which was hooked off the line by Adam Mace to prevent a Swans' third goal.

With ten minutes remaining, Mace fouled Thomas in the Evesham box and the Swans had an opportunity to put the game to bed, but Hawes' effort was high and clipped the crossbar on its way over.

There was still time for the home side to create more opportunities - Jordan Yeo had a good effort deflected over for a corner, and Edji Mbunga had a goal bound effort stopped on the line by Mace, but the Swans played out time comfortably to record the win which puts more distance between them and the sides at the bottom of the table.

Two goals conceded in the space of four first half minutes proved the undoing of a Swans side who initially took the lead, and then played against ten men for over 50 minutes. After Ben McLean had put the visitors ahead, Melksham's Kyle Tooze saw red for an elbow on Don Ogbeifun, but then a Luke Ballinger penalty followed swiftly by an Albert Hopkins strike saw the hosts take the points.

In a largely uneventful opening quarter of an hour, the only effort of note was Jay Malshanskyj's effort which took a deflection into the side netting for a corner with eleven minutes on the clock.

Melksham had a couple more efforts, one from Tooze and a second from Ballinger, but both were off target.

On 22 minutes, the visitors took the lead with their first chance of the game - Edji Mbunga and Will Hawes combined well to set up McLean, and his effort took a deflection on it's way past Melksham Keeper Matthew Hall.

Melksham responded and, after Tooze had another effort off target, a promising scramble in the box broke down when Swans Keeper Lewis Adams was fouled as he went to collect the ball.

With 38 minutes gone, the home side were reduced to ten men when Tooze elbowed Ogbeifun right in front of Referee Jack Clench, who had no hesitation in brandishing a red card.

With a minute left before half time, the hosts were back in the game - Hopkins was fouled in the Slimbridge box by Ben Hands, and Ballinger stepped up to convert the penalty and level things up.

Worse was to come for the Swans though in the second minute of stoppage time, when Malshanskyj set up Hopkins, who rifled the ball past Adams to see Melksham go in ahead at the break.

Slimbridge made a good start to the second period - Ogbeifun's long range effort was saved by Hall, and both Hawes and Myron Turner went close as Slimbridge pressed for an equaliser.

Melksham had a good spell in the middle of the second period, with a Ryan Morgan and a couple of Malshanskys efforts going close, but they were unable to increase their lead.

We keep putting this pressure on ourselves that we don't need to put on because when we conceded, we always seem to concede another.

We'll bounce back, the boys will use the frustration of today to do that, but it's disappointing, and it'll be a really annoying Sunday!

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Our History

In The Beginning

The Gloucestershire village of Slimbridge is world renowned for its Bird Sanctuary, but much hard work has gone into making Slimbridge better known in football circles.

The Club's history can be traced back to the 1899/1900 season, when the team were playing in local football at various venues in and around the village. A gap in the records suggests there may have been a couple of seasons when no games were played, and thus, officially, the Club's centenary was celebrated in 2002/03.

For the next forty-odd years the Club were predominantly members of the Stroud and District League with varying degrees of success and failure, except for a period between 1960 and 1968 when they were in the Gloucester Northern Senior League. It was not until 1951 that the current ground at Wisloe Road (Now renamed as Thornhill Park) became the club's home, and it subsequently became the legal property of the club after former player, and ex-Chairman of the club, Evi Thornhill, bequeathed the land to the Club in his Will, with the Club becoming legal owners in 1960. It was to prove an incredibly valuable treasure in future years.

Point Of Collapse

By 1988, the club had fallen on hard times, but fortunately, a handful of committee members led by Gordon King and Gordon Tudor kept the Club afloat. The following season local businessman Paul Chappell arrived. The Club was stabilised and construction of new changing facilities, to County League standard, were completed. Paul Chappell was to remain a vital part of the club until his retirement from his duties in 2020.

Our History

Start Of A New Reign

As playing standards improved, 2000 saw the completion of the building of a long awaited Social Club in an area of the ground that in it's old life had housed a cowshed. John Mack, a successful local entrepreneur, joined the club as Chairman, and he remains a committed supporter of the club to this day as Club President. In the summer of 2001, Doug Gray was appointed Manager, and the club began a period of upward momentum.

The team achieved a Runners-up spot in their first season in the Gloucester County League, and were accepted into the Hellenic League. Hellenic Division One West was won by an eleven point margin in 2002/03. A creditable fourth place finish was achieved in the Hellenic Premier League in 2003/04. In a marvellous season the club also claimed the Hellenic 'Norman Matthews' Floodlit Cup and the G.F.A. Challenge Trophy.

Arrival Of Floodlights

Floodlights arrived at the ground in the summer of 2003. A pre-season visit from Conference side Forest Green Rovers on 22nd July, produced a then ground record attendance of 427 to witness the inaugural game under lights at Wisloe Road.

A few weeks later on Sunday 24th August, that ground attendance record was beaten at a Bank Holiday Hellenic Premier Division fixture that was part of the 2003/04 annual 'Ground Hop' weekend. Local rivals Shortwood United provided the opposition in front of a crowd of 525.

Season 2004/05 again saw a fourth place finish in the Hellenic Premier. The club also made their first appearance in the F.A. Vase, which resulted in a run to the third round proper before a 2-1 extra time defeat at Western League side Backwell United.

Our History

In February 2005, Gray stood down after nearly four seasons at the helm of the club.

The club started season 2005/06 under newly appointed Manager Doug Foxwell. A first entry into the F.A. Cup saw a visit from Wessex League side Wimborne Town. A 1-0 defeat did not dampen the sense of occasion on the first day of the season. A second successful run in the F.A. Vase came to an end in the Third Round Proper, with a 3-1 defeat at South Midland Premier, Welwyn Garden City.

After a record-breaking 64 game season, the team achieved a fifth place finish in the Hellenic Premier, and the club also won the Hellenic 'Norman Matthews' Floodlit Cup and the GFA Challenge Trophy, both for the second time in three seasons.

Reserves Make Headway

The Club's Reserve side were also making progress - After two successive third place finishes in the Stroud and District League First Division, season 2005/06 saw them finally win the title and with it, promotion to the Gloucester Northern Senior League Division Two. This was the same League title that the first team won in season 1998/99 which proved the springboard for five successive first team promotions.

Rise To New Heights

Season 2006/07 proved to be the most successful in the Club's history to date, with both the First Team and Reserve side recording League and Cup doubles, with the added bonus of record-breaking F.A.Cup and Vase runs for the senior side.

In the F.A. Cup, a five match run from the Extra-Preliminary Round finished at Merthyr Tydfil in the Third Qualifying Round. Along the way there were memorable wins against two other

Southern Premier sides, 2-1 at Yate Town and 3-1 at home to Chippenham Town.

It was six matches in the F.A. Vase before defeat was tasted, the run ending in the Fifth Round Proper at home to the eventual winners, Truro City.

In the Hellenic Premier Division, bad weather, which led to a record number of postponements during the subsequently extended season, led to half a seasons fixtures being played in the final two months. A tremendous effort saw the Club bring the Championship Shield to Wisloe Road, the winning margin being three points over second placed North Leigh.

There was a rousing performance in the G.F.A. Trophy Final against Almondsbury Town. A 3-1 victory not only retained the Trophy, but recorded a third success in four seasons in that competition.

The Reserve side had an early success in the Gloucester Northern Senior League Cup with a 2-0 win against Division One Tuffley Rovers. This saw confidence rise and they went on to break a Gloucestershire Northern Senior League record in winning Division Two with a Played 30, Won 30 record.

Promotion To The Southern League

As a result of winning the league after an inspiring final day victory, and the upgrade to the ground facilities at Wisloe Road, the club were promoted into the BGB Southern League Division One Midlands for Season 2007/08, however, there was a twist to come in the tale.

Our History

Return To A New Beginning

On July 10th 2007 the club decided not to take up the promotion, and effectively, the first team took over the position in the pyramid occupied by the reserve team, which was disbanded.

The First Team reverted back to the Gloucester Northern Senior League. This meant a severe upheaval in the club both on and off the field with the manager Doug Foxwell and several senior players moving on the pastures new.

However, a loyal band of players stayed on including James Cole, who over as player manager with assistance from long term club captain Leon Sterling to begin the next stage of the club's journey.

Climb Back Up The Ladder

Four promotions followed as the club regained their previous status. James Cole handed over to Leon Sterling, who moved into the Manager's role, with Leon joined as Assistant Manager by long time Slimbridge stalwart Freddy Ward. The two guided the side to three top six finishes in their first three seasons back in the Hellenic Premier.

Switching Leagues

After the completion of the 2012-13 season, the Swans applied for a transfer to the Toolstation Western Premier League in an effort to reduce prohibitive travelling costs, a move which was approved by the FA in the Summer of 2013.

Our History

Return To The Southern League

After two seasons in the Toolstation Western Premier League, a third place finish at the end of the 2014/15 season gave the Swans a second opportunity to return to the Southern Football League. This time the club accepted the offer and took their place in the South and West Division, finishing a credible 18th in their first season, the highest level the club had ever achieved at that time in their history. Prior to the commencement of that campaign, John Mack had stepped back from Chairman duties and his position was taken up by Barry Gay.

Welcome To Thornhill Park

At the start of the 2016-17 season, and prior to our pre-season friendly fixture with neighbours Forest Green Rovers, the football ground in Wisloe Road was formally renamed to Thornhill Park in recognition of the marvellous gift we received from Evil Thornhill 46 years earlier.

Evi's son, Tony and his late wife Margaret were on hand to cut the ceremonial ribbon, and Tony made a short heartfelt speech about how much the renaming meant to him and the entire Thornhill family, and how honoured they were that the football club had recognised their father in this way.

Onwards and Upwards

A difficult two seasons of struggle at a higher level saw the eventual departure of Leon Sterling as Manager, with Freddy Ward stepping up to the plate, assisted by local footballing legend Lee Driver-Dickerson. With Freddy then stepping aside to concentrate of his last few years of playing having steadied the Swans' ship, 'Drive' took over the reins as Manager of the first team.

Our History

The Club's previous ground attendance record was smashed on 4th February 2017, when 898 fans saw the side suffer a 3-0 defeat to Hereford FC, who were working their way back up the league pyramid following their reformation after the collapse of Hereford United

The last 2 years have seen an incredible expansion of the football club– the establishment of a thriving Youth setup at Under 18 level, and the resurrection of the Reserve side has seen Slimbridge AFC make great strides as a club.

Prior to the Covid suspension of football in March 2020, the Under 18s and the Reserves were top of their respective leagues, while the first team were sitting in 12th place in the Southern League Division One South, the highest placing in the history of the football club. Although the FA has made the season's results null and void, they have been officially added to club statistics and all appearances and goals will stand in our records as a permanent tribute to all who represented the club in a fantastic season in the strangest of all campaigns

The Club has gained a great local reputation both on and off the pitch for looking after players and developing them in their careers - Already some of those previously with the club in the last 2 seasons have moved to Conference South level to ply their trade.

It is a tribute to the committed and very talented team of coaches and managers in place at all levels of the club, that the future is very bright indeed for the Swans...
